Limited concessions will be available at the arena for purchase during the shows and sale. Please pack/plan accordingly as its known to get hot and humid in July in the arena.


## Photo Contest

### Pipestone Lamb and Wool Facility Tour, June 9th, 2014

The Pipestone Lamb and Wool Program, dedicated to changing sheep production to make it more profitable for producers, is excited to offer an idea filled sheep facility tour. The Pipestone Lamb and Wool program offers this tour every other year and this will be the fourth tour offered. The purpose of the tour is to give producers an opportunity to see various types of sheep facilities, including the latest innovations in sheep buildings, handling systems, feeding systems and facility layout.

The tour will be a full day, visiting four Lamb and Wool producers with new and remodeled facilities. All of these operations have devised their buildings and feeding systems to reduce labor and enable them to run larger numbers of ewes with the same labor. Tour participants will see lambing barns, hoop barns, remodeled buildings along with various feeding systems designed to reduce labor and minimize feed waste. In addition, this will be an opportunity to hear the philosophy of sheep production from four successful sheep producers.

## Sign-up for Disaster Assistance Programs Begins

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced that eligible farmers and ranchers can sign up for U.S. Department of Agriculture disaster assistance programs restored by passage of the 2014 Farm Bill.

Depending on the size and type of farm or ranch operation, eligible producers can enroll in a number of programs administered by the Farm Service Agency (FSA). The Livestock Forage Disaster Program and the Livestock Indemnity Program will provide payments to eligible producers for livestock deaths and grazing losses that have occurred since the expiration of the livestock disaster assistance programs in 2011, including calendar years 2012, 2013 and 2014. The Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program provides emergency assistance to eligible producers of livestock, honeybees and farm-raised fish that have suffered losses because of disease, severe weather, blizzards and wildfires.

Producers signing up for these programs are encouraged to contact their local FSA office for information on the types of records needed and to schedule an appointment. Taking these steps in advance will help producers ensure their application moves through the process as quickly as possible.

## ALB and NSIIC Nominations Welcome

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is seeking nominations for individuals to serve on the boards of the 2015 American Lamb Board (ALB) and the National Sheep Industry Improvement Center (NSIIC). Nominations to both boards are due to the American Sheep Industry Association (ASI) by May 15.

The ALB has two positions held by sheep producers that are up for appointment -- one for a producer who owns less than 100 head of sheep annually and one for a producer who owns more than 500 head of sheep annually. One of the nominees must be from Region 1 - east of the Mississippi River.

The NSIIC board will have three vacancies. Members whose appointments will expire are Linda Campbell (Va.) and Rochelle Oxarango (Idaho), both representing producers, and Greg Ahart (Calif.), representing expertise in marketing. Even though all current members are eligible to be re-nominated to their positions, Oxarango and Ahart will not be seeking re-nomination.

Those interested in being considered should contact their state sheep producer association, ASI director, regional representative or the ASI office.
