Annual Member Meeting

July 14, 2023

Meeting was called to order by Vice President Susie Skinner at 4:30 pm CDT at the VFW in Little Falls, Minnesota. Directors present were Susie Skinner, Jeff Nevens, Jack McRae, Dylan Laverell, Wendell Von Krosigk. Leroy Pedersen was absent.

Minutes from the January 2023 semi annual meeting were reviewed. Bob Padula moved to approve the minutes as presented, Randall Von Krosigk seconded. Passed

Financial reports were reviewed for profit and loss comparison from 2021 to 2022 and year to date. A chart of accounts showing balances from last three years was also reviewed. There was no discussion. Susan Millikin moved to accept the reports as is. William Reppert seconded. Passed.

Registration report was than viewed. Numbers are down again. 2023 is projecting to be lower yet again. Membership was asked if they had any comments/concerns with Associated Registry. All comments were positive.

Scott Kilber said DATA is looking at hosting the 2024 National Show and Sale in Redfield, South Dakota again around July 18-20th. Lodging was an issue last time, and he's looking into ways to help alleviate that.

Committees gave a report next.

Starter Flock – Scott Kilber reported there were 13 applications this year from which 2 winners were selected. He recognized Jeff and Leslie Nevens for getting this program going and all of their years of service on the committee.

Juniors – Newly elected Junior President Carissa Scheel gave update from the annual Junior meeting the prior day. They are looking at ways to improve their association and raise money. They are received no ambassador applications.

Todd Taylor reported the All-American will be in Michigan this year starting July 4th. Entry fee of around \$1000 will be the same if they keep the classes the same. Last year there were 42 head of Targhees exhibited. Jeff Nevens moved to approve the Association paying for the 2024 All American registration fee. Lacy Raisler seconded. Passed.

Jackie McMartin moved to sponsor \$500 for the 2024 Great Plains Junior Show entry fee. Last 2 years USTSA had split the fee with DATA each paying \$250. George Mann commented that youth is the future of the organization and this is a good promotion. Randall Von Krogisk seconded. Passed.

Standards and Sifting – Jack McRae was on the sifting committee along with vet and 2 local breeders. 2 animals had been sifted for mouth and coarse wool. He commented on the high quality of sheep this year. Jack also wanted it on official record in case it wasn't prior that sheep donated to the starter flock be included in the sifting. Jon Beastrom seconded, Passed.

NSIP – Dylan Laverell's is the Targhee rep for NSIP. He had nothing new to report.

Nominations were called for 3 times for Central Plains Director and At Large East Director. Susie Skinner nominated Scott Kilber and Jackie McMartin. George Mann moved to close nominations and unanimous ballots be cast for Scott Kilber for Central Plains Director and Jackie McMartin for At Large East Director. Seconded by Paula Brakke. Passed.

Floor price was discussed for 2023 Sale. William Reppert moved for \$300 floor price. Dylan Laverell seconded. Passed.

The proposed By Law change allowing a Board member to be Secretary and/or Treasurer was discussed. Lisa Reppert questioned if a Board of Director had to be a member of the USTSA. They do, but Secretary does not have to be. Jack McRae explained the board may or may not take advantage of this change as its good to have someone outside of the Board be in charge of the finances, but would offer some flexibility. Scott Kilber motioned to approve the change to By Laws as written in the agenda. Jon Beastrom seconded. Passed.

The proposed new Promotional position that was shared in the last Targhee Talk was reviewed. George Mann asked if the position should pay more in the beginning as it will take more time than. Lynette Taylor asked if this is paid per hour. Dylan Laverell clarified that it is a salary position and is negotiable. The break down was just to get an idea of time required. Susie Skinner added that the Board has been working on this for some time as current Secretary, Mardy Rutledge, will not be with the Association much longer. Jack McRae added the Board wanted the memberships input prior to posting the job. Kari Premsiri and her husband have run social media for a farmer's market and it will be a lot of upfront work. They offered to help with the social media and suggested splitting up duties. Bob Padula suggested a flexible contract to take into account the update time input. Paula Brakke offered to continue helping with the newsletter proofing it. Scott Kilber moved to approve creating a Promotion Position. George Mann seconded the motion. Passed. The board asked if members had any further input to reach out to them prior to the job being posted.

Susie Skinner recognized Jeff Nevens for his years for service on the board of USTSA and thanked Missy Holtz for putting on a great National Show. Jack McRae also recognized Leroy Pedersen for his time on the Board and as President.

Jeff Nevens requested the membership's opinion. They are selling their last sheep and want to donate the proceeds to youth. The Holtz family is donating a ewe lamb to the juniors for a roll over auction already, so he wanted thoughts on how to sell his ram. Paula Brakke moved for the 2 donations be sold after the starter flock presentation with proceeds for the Nevens sale going 50/50 to starter flock and futurity programs. Jack McRae seconded. Passed.

Scott Kilber moved to adjourn the meeting. Dylan Laverell seconded. Passed
